

Scheduling Policies per Mad River Mountain Ski Patrol Policies and Procedures

Excerpt from Policies and Procedures Sixth Revision – October 2010

Candidates: 3.2.2.3 Duty Schedule

- “1 The Candidate Patroller must commit to a duty schedule that consists of one weekday second or third shift, one weekend shift, each week and three “primetime” midnight madness shifts during their candidacy.
- 2 Candidates may only participate in training sessions during their schedule duty shift at the discretion of the Hill Leader.”

3.4 SCHEDULING

- “1 All patrollers and patrol candidates are required to work at least 1.1 hours for each day that the Mad River Mountain Ski Area is open to the skiing public. Therefore, it is expected that patrollers be signed up for an average of 8 hours per week (excluding full time Mid Mad patrollers.)
- 2 All patrollers and patrol candidates are expected to maintain at least the minimum number of hours throughout the season.
- 3 All patrollers are required to schedule two midnight madness with at least one selection falling within the last week of December to the first week of March.
- 4 Daytime (first and second shift) patrollers may schedule two shifts on different weekdays, a first and second shift on a single day, or a first or second shift on a weekday and an “A” or “B” weekend shift.
- 5 Evening (third shift) patrollers must schedule a third shift on a weekday and an “A” or “B” weekend shift.
- 6 Regular Midnight Madness patrollers must schedule a MidMad shift every weekend or
Schedule a MidMad shift every other weekend with a Saturday Day/Evening or Sunday Evening shift on the in between weeks.”
